The aims of the course (maximum 500 characters)	The course aims at helping students to develop deep understanding and tools necessary for analyzing factors affecting employment, wages, working conditions, and unemployment - basic characteristic of every labour market. Students learn how to analyze main factors influencing labour market development, preparing a project concentrated on one chosen, specific labour market analysis. They learn how to make use of available resources in order to analyze current status and predict future changes in the are of work.
The content of the course: main topics and key ideas	Basic terms describing labour market operations. Labour demand and supply- basic theories and practices. Basic methods and sources for labour market analysis. Government regulations, labour market policies. Inequality, wealth, poverty and labour market. Discrimination and labour markets. Globalisation and technological change. Training programmes, education and labour market. Self employment and labour market. Public support for unemployed.
